DISSERTATION ABSTRACT

I use the case of opioid use to investigate how the places in which people live affect their health and wellbeing. Using in-depth interviews and over two years of participant observation with 65 people who use drugs and 180 government officials and service providers across ten counties in California, I describe the dynamics of small-town drug scenes and official efforts to manage drug use. I contribute to debates in sociology of health, crime, and law by developing a general theory of “place effects” and defining the “acquainted marginality” found in small and isolated places.
